# Looking back on events in April and May

**Spring fundraisers:** The *Coffee* & *Shop* at St Chad's in April had a good turn out on a sunny morning, and £640 was raised while people browsed the stalls, chatted with friends, and ate cake. The following weekend was an altogether rainier affair, but the *Bluebell Walk* at Tushingham Hall still attracted a steady stream of visitors and, together with teas and stalls, raised over £1,200 for the Hospice and Church. Then, in May, the *Open Gardens* afternoon welcomed visitors across three beautiful local gardens, with the added delights of afternoon teas, Pimms and a children's treasure hunt. Sincere thanks to all those who worked so hard to host, volunteer and support these events.

Coronation weekend: The bells 'Rang for the King' in Tushingham on Coronation Day, with the novices of St Chad's generously supported by ringers from the Tilston, Malpas, Tarporley, and Waverton towers.





This was followed on Sunday by a picnic including a splendid iced Coronation cake in the glorious sunshine in the field outside Old St Chad's, prior to a Coronation Service. A congregation of young and old (and dog!) was warmly welcomed.

**Walking Festival:** Finally, Old St Chad's was the star attraction once more in May, marking the mid-morning stop on one of the walks on

the first day of the Whitchurch Walking Festival, entitled, 'Alone in the Fields'. The walkers – some of whom had never seen or been inside the Chapel before – took the weight off their feet and paused for reflection, enjoying the tranquillity of this beautiful part of Cheshire.

# **Volunteering for nature**

## Wildflower and tree nursery at Bickley

Spring has sprung in the Cheshire Wildlife Trust nursery at Bickley Hall Farm, bringing with it longer days, warmer temperatures, and a lot of work to do.

Last year we grew around 9,000 wildflower plugs in our wildflower nursery, which have since been planted out across the county as part of our meadow creation work – helping to reverse the decline of this important habitat.



In addition, we have been working hard over the autumn and winter to set up a new tree nursery. Seed collected from across Cheshire is being grown to help create new native woodland whilst ensuring local genetics are retained.

We can't do it all by ourselves though.

We need volunteers to come and lend a hand with pricking out, potting on, weeding and watering. Based at our headquarters in Bickley Hall Farm near Malpas we will be running **fortnightly volunteer days**. Whether you're a veteran gardener, or a complete novice looking to acquire new skills, we welcome volunteers of all ages and abilities.

#### News from St Chad's

**Genesis 1:** In the beginning God created the world and all that was within it and God saw that it was good.

The Church is the body of people who believe this statement and many others that are found in the Holy Bible – people in

this generation (and previous ones) who believe they have heard God's call in their lives. But the Church also refers to the buildings in which they meet to worship God, to listen to His Word and to receive the Sacraments.

We are blessed to have not one church building but two. Our Victorian Church that sits proudly on the A41 and our little treasure Old St Chad that sits equally as proud out in the fields alone.

Once upon a premodern culture, church played a significant and important role in the life of every community. Each Sabbath (Sunday), was a day of rest and refreshment and families would come to church to meet one another and thank God for their daily needs, pray for the needs of those in their community and be inspired or challenged by the words of the Preacher.

What inspired me to write this letter was an awareness of an organisation called *Friends of Friendless Churches*. Founded in 1957, 'they save historic but redundant places of worship from destruction and decay.'

The last few generations have given over to side heavily with science, and religion has taken a backward step. For me, the study of science seeks to give the How's of this world and its creation but rarely gives the Why's! This, I believe, is because the only place to seek the Why's is found in the heart and purpose of its Creator! I also believe true satisfaction of the heart, soul and mind can only come from seeking our true purpose in life and in seeking our identity; both of which I believe are again found in the One who created us.

There may well be historic buildings that have become places that no longer have friends to meet within them and need to be saved, but here in our small rural communities there are committed friends who continue to seek God, pray for the needs of others, and long for God Himself to be known to all once again.

Fed up with what the world offers? Then come seek the alternative – as we keep the doors to our Church OPEN!

# **Bradley Unaffiliated Independent Congregational Chapel**

**Chapel Anniversary: Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> June, 2.30 pm** service led by Hon. Pastor Mike Valentine Soloist: Rachel Tuft; Chapel organist: Gwen Reeves

At the church meeting on 16<sup>th</sup> April, the congregation warmly authorised (with no dissent), the following:

- a) Continued traditional hymns and communion services between ongoing quarterly church meeting services.
- b) Appointment of Brian Andrew Faulkner as an additional Honorary Pastor with full authority to conduct all sacraments.
- c) Where possible and appropriate, for future Bradley Chapel services to be held on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of the month.

A pen portrait: Hon. Pastor Brian Andrew Faulkner, appointed 16th April 2023

In 1970, Pastor Brian became an accredited Methodist Local Preacher after completing, as did we all, 2 years of study, and then passing four examinations.

Bradley Chapel, founded in 1897, has always been based on Congregational Governance principles, where decision-making authority rests with the congregation in church meetings, <u>not</u> with their appointed Pastors. In 1972 the United Reformed Church was created, including Presbyterians, some Anglicans and a majority of Congregational Chapels. At Bradley the decision was taken to remain totally self-governing, independent and unaffiliated by <u>not</u> becoming part of any existing or new denomination. Within the old Whitchurch Methodist circuit, there remained a close Bradley relationship. Not only was Chapel helped by local Methodist Preachers, but for over 50 years it was formally included on the circuit's Quarterly Plan – a listing of Preachers' planned appointments. That was still the case when Pastor Mike came to Whitchurch in 2000.

However, Brian has been preaching at Bradley for well over 50 years, remembering 6.30 pm services under the leadership of Mr Wycherley. This was even before the stewardship of Tony Green. He remembers three organists – Mrs Green, Mrs Mitchell and Hilda Thomason, each using a well-thumbed 'Sankey' hymn book! Pastor Brian brings to Bradley a wealth of knowledge of both local chapels and their families, many of whose children he taught in Sunday School! We look forward to sharing a strengthened and extended local ministry and service of Bradley Unaffiliated, Independent Congregational Chapel.

#### Reading volunteers needed

To help Tushingham Primary School promote a love of reading, anyone from the community who has spare time on a regular basis is invited to come and read in school with the children. Here at **Tushingham CE Primary School** there is lots to report, and even more to look forward to. Spring term ended on a high, with Class 3's production of the Easter story full of bright, confident performances. The school also had much to be proud of on World Maths Day, when Years 1–6 competed online in the World Mathletics challenge.

Out of tens of thousands of children in each year group, McKenzie came 134<sup>th</sup> in the country, and our Year 6 group came 99<sup>th</sup> in the WORLD!

Class 1 learned about the living world by watching caterpillars grow and turn into butterflies and then setting them free, while Classes 2–4 enjoyed visits to local Yew Tree Farm to experience lambing. This connects with their learning topics in science and PHSE and we look forward to developing this link together with LEAF Education who aim 'to equip future generations with balanced and informed insight into food production, farming and the environment.' We also had important visits from the NSPCC to talk about online safety, and from the police about 'Stranger Danger'.

Art lessons have been wonderfully varied, with junk modelling of emergency vehicles (Class 1), art and puppets on the theme of lions (Class 2), Matisse collages (Class 3), and Frida Kahlo-inspired Mexican portraits (Class 4).

Out in the playground, the coach from Hollies Tennis Club motivated our children to enjoy tennis, and Bikeability provided cycling training for Class 4. We were also visited by the Mission Aviation Fellowship (MAF) charity who



brought one of the small fleet of planes they use to support people in isolated areas of the world. In addition, thanks to more good weather, we had a picnic and games afternoon to royally mark the Coronation.

The Summer term continued with a Toddler Teddy Bear's Picnic, and Class 3 had an amazing residential at Robinwood Activity Centre – canoeing, caving climbing, zip wiring and more! Yet to come is the Class 4 Adventure Activity Day, Sports' Day and the Summer Fair. *Plus:* Mrs Davies is going on her own adventure to Uganda at half-term on a self-funded trip that aims to develop a learning link with a school in Ibanda, helping our children to understand what it is like in other parts of the world, and building a global community.

The Summer term finishes on Friday 21<sup>st</sup> July, and the new school year begins again on Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> September. Happy holidays!

# **Bradley Barns Nursery**

Here at Bradley Barns Nursery, we continue to move forward into the Spring with many different events.

The nicer weather has started to see the Forest School bloom into new life and allow the children to spend even more time bug hunting, bird spotting, den building and planting vegetable seeds, to name but a

few activities. The seeds were purchased from a local farm shop after a visit made by the staff and Pre-School children to see the varieties on offer. We also welcomed lambs from our sheep, incubated and hatched our own bantam chicks and welcomed two new rabbits. And, in continued development here at the Nursery, the Pre-School building is being expanded to allow for better storage of puddle suits and wellies, to make changing a much easier task when entering and leaving the Forest School.

The King's Coronation was celebrated with a tea party, including the usual array of sandwiches and healthy treats. The children really enjoyed making crowns and floral headwear to enjoy this Royal occasion. The Pre-School children also had a visit to see the flowers and displays at Malpas Church.

Fundraising continues to be a part of Nursery life here, including an Easter raffle, *Bag2School*, and plant sales – raising money for some resources and also for those less fortunate than ourselves.

We were pleased to receive a 'Good' rating from Ofsted, on only the second day of our return into the New Year. This reflects the hard work and commitment from all the staff, who put a great deal of effort into the daily routines of all the children here.
