



Impact Statement

We are proud of the PE curriculum and sporting opportunities that we have on offer at Tushingham Primary School, which aim to inspire and motivate all children to become physically confident and know the importance of living a healthy lifestyle. Our key values, including team work, resilience, determination and fair play, are taught and promoted as a golden thread throughout our PE curriculum. We believe that these skills can be applied to wider life experiences, contributing to the development of the whole child.

The sport premium funding has helped to develop the children's confidence, skills and enjoyment of sports. Staff confidence has also increased as a direct result of the PE CPD sessions and our new planning and assessment tools, which ensures sustainability.

We strive hard to give all children opportunities to apply their skills in competitive situations, either within teams or individually, ensuring that we remain competitive and inclusive. Children from reception to year 6 now represent the school in a wide variety of sporting events including multi-skills, football, athletics, rounders, hockey, tag rugby, swimming, cricket, basketball and netball. Many of our children now also regularly take part in extra-curricular sports, and we ensure that we not only celebrate in-school achievements, but also out-of-school sporting achievements.

We now have a strong uptake towards our competitive events, and as a result, we have been able to enter two teams to many tournaments. In the 2018-2019 academic year, we took two teams to 29% (4 out of 14) of the competitions, and our vision was for this to increase to 64% (9 out of 14) for the 2019-2020 academic year. Unfortunately, due to school closures, inter-schools competitions were cancelled, but we remain focussed and determined to continue to provide inclusive and competitive sporting experiences for all of the children at Tushingham when Covid-19 restrictions are lifted.
