



## **Primary School Physical Education (PE) and Sport Premium**

The Secretary of State for Education continues to provide funding to improve the provision of Physical Education (PE) and sport in primary schools for academic year 2020-2021. This funding is being jointly provided by the Department for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and it must be used to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport, to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles.

Ofsted assesses how primary schools use the primary PE and sport premium. They measure its impact on pupil outcomes, and how effectively governors hold school leaders to account for this. Schools therefore have to ensure that they can identify the impact that the funding has made towards enhancing participation rates in PE and sport, encouraging healthy, active lifestyles and helping children reach the performance levels that they are capable of. Schools will have the freedom to choose how they wish to use their money.

All schools with 17 or more pupils receive £16,000 plus £10 per pupil

**Total amount of sports funding allocated = £ 16,860.00**

### **How will Tushingham School be using the money to improve PE and sports provision?**

- **Purchasing of resources to support teachers with planning and assessment of PE**

Time to research, plan and implement purchased quality assured planning and assessment materials for all PE modules across the EYFS, KS1 and KS2 PE curriculum.

- **Providing children with opportunities to take part in competitive sports**

Broxton Rural Education Improvement Partnership School Sport Co-ordinator Role.

Commitment made for the academic year. Breakdown of package:

- Competitive event organisation and running
- Heber ambassadors training/planning
- Continual Professional Development sessions for cluster schools
- Buddy training for years 5/6
- Primary Link Teacher (PLT) group meetings

- **Tushingham Primary School PE subject leader role:**

Non-contact time allocated in school budget

**Breakdown of time for PE subject leader role:**

- Event organisation and team preparation

- Coordination of the competitive sporting calendar for YR-Y6
- Participation in Chester District School Sports Association meetings and events (virtual meetings due to Covid-19 restrictions)
- Organising staff CPD
- Organising CPD Programme for school staff including sport specific training and inclusion training
- PE Subject Leader works alongside primary teachers and PE link Governor to develop a long term rolling programme to ensure a broad and balanced PE curriculum, with sequential and progressive application of skills, is being taught.
- PE Subject Leader supports primary teachers when they are planning PE lessons.
- PE Subject Leader supports primary teachers to assess children's performance and progression in PE.
- Liaise with teachers and sports coaches to develop next steps for individuals and groups of children.
- Ensuring sustainability and monitoring impact of school sports and PE
- Provide additional resources to support remote learning

- **Additional spending:**

- Cost of cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport
- Paying for professional development opportunities in PE/sport
- Purchasing fruit for KS2 to encourage healthy eating
- Buying equipment for PE/sport
- Buying high quality playtime resources to encourage active lifestyles
- Hiring qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE
  - S.R.F.D. (sports coaches) in school for 4 sessions per week – YN-Y6
  - S.R.F.D. lead after school sports club for YR – Y2 once a week.
  - Swimming coach for 5 one hour sessions in spring term - Y3/4
